Kogei Artist (Dyeing)

Japan

Born in Osaka Prefecture. Graduated from the Department of Oil Painting of Kyoto City University of Arts in 1968. From the latter half of the 1970s she began to produce

tie-dyed works using indigo, then in 1987 and 1989, she attracted people's attention at the Lausanne International Tapestry Biennial with a three-dimensional wall hanging and a suspended work consisting of multiple layers of indigo-dyed fabric. Her work is characterized by her use of turpan cotton and linen fabrics originating from both Japan and abroad; utilizing the attributes of each material she adopts numerous tying techniques, such as gradation and bleeding, to dye them in a variety of colors, from a deep indigo blue to white. She then uses these to create artistic spaces, either two-dimensionally or as components for installations, etc., her contemporary forms, combined with her skill as a dyer, winning her international acclaim. She Lives in Kyoto City, Kyoto Prefecture.

Mr. Murose Kazumi

Kogei Artist (Urushi art)

Japan

Born in Tokyo. Studied *urushi* art under Taguchi Yoshikuni at the graduate school of Tokyo University of the Arts. He also studied under his father, Murose Shunji and

Matsuda Gonroku, learning a wide range of traditional techniques, but focusing on *maki-e*. Basing his activities around the *Japan Traditional Kogei Exhibition*,* he produces consistently creative work and has become a leader in the contemporary *urushi* art field. From an early period he has been involved in the preservation and restoration of national treasures and important cultural properties, in addition to working actively to repair and study lacquer works internationally. Based on his study of classic works, he utilizes every form of *maki-e* and mother-of-pearl inlay technique to produce multicolored, refined, decorous natural designs of flowers and birds, etc., that are filled with dignity. He was designated the holder of an Important Intangible Cultural Property (*maki-e*) in 2008. He lives in Shinjuku Ward, Tokyo.

Mr. Maeta Akihiro

Kogei Artist (Ceramics)

Japan

Born in Tottori Prefecture. Graduated from the Craft Department of Osaka University of Arts in 1977. While still in university, he became fascinated with forms in white porcelain and ever since

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he has devoted himself to the creation of these, expressing his personal aesthetics through their natural, soft whiteness. He attracted widespread attention in 1991 when he won the Japan Ceramic Art Exhibition Award and subsequently has continued to build on his reputation through his activities in the Japan Traditional *Kogei* Exhibition, etc. After he has thrown a pot on the wheel he uses his fingers to produce ridges, then cuts flat planes in the surface to create a feeling of quiet strength, the rich swellings giving rise to a delicate shading that is truly beautiful. He was designated a holder of an Important Intangible Cultural Property (white porcelain) in 2013. He lives in Tottori City, Tottori Prefecture.

In 2003, he embarked on a journey to Australia where he pursued his higher education in the art of ceramic making at the Chisholm Institution in Victoria and the National Arts School in Sydney. Upon his graduation with a Bachelor Degree in Fine Arts with Distinctions from the National Art School in 2006, Alvin undertook his postgraduate program at the Australian National University in 2010. Under the sponsorship of NAFA, Alvin successfully obtained the Master of Visual Arts in 2011.

As an object maker, Alvin Tan produces ceramic objects that attempts to present subjective interpretation of the existential dilemma of our current age. He had vividly exhibited locally and aboard. Alvin was a feature Singaporean artist at the Singapore High Commission in Australia at the celebration of Singapore's 46th National Day. His works are collected by private collectors from Singapore, Malaysia, Taiwan and Australia, as well as various institutions- The Australian Institute of Architects, The Canberra School of Arts, NAFA Gallery, Ngee Ann Kongsi, are also one of his collectors.

Norma Respicio is a PhD holder in Philippine Studies from the University of the Philippines, Diliman. Her primary fields of specialization are; 1) the history and aesthetics of traditional art forms with special focus





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on the textiles of the Philippines (and Southeast Asia) and those of Japan (and East Asia), 2) the management and documentation of tangible and intangible art forms (e.g., songs, epics, indigenous skills and technology), and 3) the safeguarding of heritage sites (built and natural) in the Philippines.
